Matthew 26.26-28

And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. Mark 8.31

On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead as promised, foreshadowing the future of a united Israel.

He will revive us after two days; He will raise us up on the third day,

That we may live before Him. Hosea 6.2

The above prophecy applies to the progeny of the former northern kingdom of Israel and the of the former southern kingdom of Judah. God, through his exposed arm, Jesus of Nazareth, laid the foundation for the new Israel foretold by God's prophets.

And the body of Christ is us, dear brothers and sisters of the Lord!


Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it. 1 Corinthian 12.27

Therefore prophesy and say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God, "Behold, I will open your graves and cause you to come up out of your graves, My people; and I will bring you into the land of Israel. Ezekiel 37.11-12

God's exposed arm, Jesus of Nazareth, who described himself as a son of man, now takes us out of his herd, his kingdom of light – Christianity – and leads us into the land of Israel, promised to our ancestors for all eternity, to unite us with our Jewish brothers and sisters.



Say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God, "Behold, I will take the sons of Israel from among the nations where they have gone, and I will gather them from every side and bring them into their own land; and I will make them one nation in the land, on the mountains of Israel; and one king will be king for all of them;

and they will no longer be two nations

and no longer be divided into two kingdoms. Ezekiel 37.21-22

He says, "It is too small a thing that you should be My Servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also make you a light of the nations so that My salvation may reach to the end of the earth." Isaiah 49.6
