



The Kingdom of God

*Jesus was going through all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and **proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom**, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness.* MATTHEW 9:35

When Jesus came to Earth as a man to live and learn among us humans, he announced the coming Kingdom of Heaven, the Kingdom of God.

Based on your questions, my dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, I recognise that many believers believe Jesus was speaking of a Kingdom of God outside of our world. Consequently, several believers think that they can only enter this Heavenly kingdom after their physical death or rapture.

*But I say to you truthfully, **there are some of those standing here who will not taste death until they see the kingdom of God.*** LUCAS 9:27

What Jesus is clearly saying here is that, among his followers, some will see the Kingdom of God before their death. With the outpouring of his Holy Spirit and the founding of the first Christian communities, this prophecy by Jesus became reality.

In his prominent work "The City of God," the famous Doctor of the Church, Augustine of Hippo (354 - 430 AD), wrote the following: "the current Church on Earth is both the Kingdom of Christ and the Kingdom of Heaven." Only with the onset of the Middle Ages, as the Catholic Church began to gain political power and the abuse of said power took root, was the myth of the Kingdom of God in the afterlife created.

*From the days of John the Baptist until now **the kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and violent men take it by force.*** MATTHEW 11:12

Only in our world can the Kingdom of God be violated. All the righteous chosen by God live in God's dimension, which lies beyond the power of our imagination. This dimension already existed before God created our universe. So why would God have announced a kingdom through Jesus, which already existed since the beginning of his creation, and into which the righteous have always been admitted?

All of us, dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, the entire Body of Christ, are undoubtedly the Kingdom of God or Kingdom of Heaven that God announced and created through Jesus, and through us created the multitude and diversity of Christian communities and churches!



Through His flesh and blood, Jesus, God teaches us to love our enemies and fulfil their requests.

*But I say to you, **love your enemies** and pray for those who persecute you. MATTHEW 5:44
Whoever forces you to go one mile, go with him two. **Give to him who asks of you,**
and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you. MATTHEW 5:41-42*

This lesson is irrefutable, as it is the Word of God, but this lesson is incompatible with the impending challenges of our time. Oriental religions are pushing into Western civilisation with an aggressiveness that is opposed to freedom. The history of mankind has shown that peace-loving civilisations are outmatched by aggressive ones. That is why God will strengthen His believers in His Christian kingdom on the one hand, and on the other hand will solve this problem by once again revealing Himself to all people through Jesus, in the form of His body (which is us), during the resurrection of Israel.

Isaiah's prophecy about God's Messiah:

*He says, "It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant to **raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also make You a light of the nations** So that My salvation may reach to the end of the earth."* Isaiah 49:6

Jesus, God's flesh and blood on Earth, built up a kingdom over the last two millennia, the Kingdom of Light, which we have named Christianity. All of us still belong to this kingdom.

Another one of Jesus' tasks is to raise the twelve tribes of Israel once again. That is why Jesus symbolically and prophetically said:

*And Jesus said to them, "Truly I say to you, that you who have followed Me, in the **2** regeneration **1** when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you also shall sit upon twelve thrones, **3** judging the twelve tribes of Israel."* MATTHEW 19:28

- 1** The Throne of Glory, upon which Jesus has sat for two millennia, is the Kingdom of Light, Christianity. ✓
- 2** Jesus defines the descendants of Jacob as those Christian believers who were born again through baptism with the Holy Spirit. ✓
- 3** Jesus will now raise the twelve tribes of Israel and bring them to the land promised to their ancestors.

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, every born-again Christian who loves Israel and his/her Jewish brothers and sisters recognises these words as the Word of God, and therefore has put down their name for relocation to Israel on the website: www.united-israel.org, are descendants in the bloodline of Jacob!



The Body of Christ will unite with the House of Judah before the eyes of the entire world, and Israel will rise again as prophesied. God will open the eyes of our Jewish brother and sisters, and they will also understand through us that Jesus of Nazareth is the Messiah that was promised to them.

Consequently, the Kingdom of God consists of two earthly empires: The Kingdom of Light, or Christianity, and the twelve tribes of Jacob, or unified Israel. God will lead Christianity through his appointed followers, as He has done so far, and those chosen by Him will lead the new, unified Israel democratically and turn it into an exemplary nation for all the world.

Jesus compared John the Baptist to Elijah, probably the most prominent prophets of the former Northern Kingdom of Israel.

*But I say to you **that Elijah already came**, and they did not recognize him, but did [a]to him whatever they wished. So also the Son of Man is going to suffer at their hands.” Then the disciples understood **that He had spoken to them about John the Baptist.** MATTHEW 17:12-13*

Elijah reawakened the dead and brought the longed-for rain to Israel. Jesus said that even the most lowly in the coming Kingdom of God shall be greater than John the Baptist!

*Truly I say to you, among those born of women there has not arisen anyone greater than John the Baptist! **Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.** MATTHEW 11:11*

This means that we will all be greater and stronger in power, responsibility, and justice than those deemed righteous by God in ancient times.

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, we must be aware of this, as individual believers, as communities and churches, and as the whole Body of Christ. We must, we can, and we will change this world - if not us, then who? It is within our ability and our responsibility to eradicate the world's failings by strengthening the Kingdom of God on Earth for the glorification of His son and anointed Jesus!

May God bless us all with new self-confidence and grant us insight into our divine and lordly mission and lead us to the land of our ancestors for the glorification of our Lord Jesus! Amen!
